Additions to Treaty Settlement Land The Approach

The Province and Canada will consider First Nation request to add land to its TSL if:

- The First Nation owns the land in fee simple
- The land is within the First Nation's traditional territory
- Jurisdiction:
 - If the land is within municipal boundaries, it requires municipal consent
 - Regional district consent is not required but is taken into consideration

Additions to Treaty Settlement Land


Other factors to be considered

- Contiguous with existing Treaty Settlement Land
- Overlap to be resolved (Canada)
- Ownership of subsurface resources
- Existing Interests

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Removal of Land from Agricultural Land Reserve

The approach

At Effective Date:

- Land will be removed from ALR

Post Effective Date:

- Exclusion of land from the ALR will be in accordance with the *Agricultural Land Commission Act*
