THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the UBCM:

1. urge the Federal Government to consult with all Canadians, and especially local government jurisdictions, much more widely and comprehensively than it has in the past, and to do so much earlier in the process prior to contemplating any Canadian negotiating positions with respect to international trade agreements of all kinds;

2. while recognizing that trade can have beneficial impacts on local economies, recommends strongly to the Federal Government that it bring forward a proposal to the WTO to exclude "local governments and authorities" from the definition of a "measure" under Article I of the GATS agreement, and further that Canada work actively to seek support for this amendment from the other WTO members;

3. request the Federal Government to not include sub-national governments in Canada under the requirements of the Agreement on Government Procurement;

4. urge the Federation of Canadian Municipalities to continue to dedicate staff to closely monitoring WTO discussions and the activities of the Federal Government in this regard, and also to alert Canadian local governments of any potential encroachments on their jurisdiction and authority resulting from trade agreements.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. The UBCM endorse the three goals for senior government support:

- Continued provincial support for public transportation to keep pace with growth;

- Federal tax exemption for employer provided transit benefits; and

2. The UBCM establish a task force to coordinate local government efforts to achieve the three goals for senior government support for public transportation; and

3. The UBCM encourage all local government elected officials to immediately contact their existing MP's and MLA's, and those who would seek office in the upcoming elections, on the need for new federal support and continued provincial support for public transportation.

The following recommendations were put forward for member consideration:

1. That the UBCM membership support participation by the UBCM Communities and Resources Committee in the development of strategies deemed by the Executive to support the promotion of BC wood and wood products.

2. That the provincial government:

- immediately commence LRMPs in those regions of the province not yet underway and complete the Central Coast LRMP by March 31, 2001 as announced by the Minister;

- publicly state that where legitimate, provincially sanctioned land use plans are in place, those land use decisions will be respected and not reopened for discussion; and

- restate its commitment to open door negotiations over public resources and advise that all parties interested in land use decision making need to participate at the LRMP or similar table(s).

3. That the forest industry jointly with local, provincial and federal governments work together to establish an internationally recognized and acceptable certification system.

4. That the forest industry, provincial and federal governments provide adequate funding for the establishment of domestic and international campaigns to promote BC wood/wood products; and sustainable BC forest practices; and where possible;

That all three parties work together in conjunction with other affected groups such as UBCM, IWA, First Nations and others to coordinate and dovetail initiatives to avoid duplication and maximize the resources available.

5. That the UBCM membership reaffirm its support for the public land use process.

The following is the disposition of those recommendations:
