



Environmental Protection Division








Provincial MSW Framework

- Environmental Management Act (EMA)
 - 38 Regulations and Codes of Practice
 - Prescribes industry, trade, and business needing site-specific authorizations
 - Requires regional district solid waste management plans (SWMP)





Provincial MSW Framework

- Regulation
 - Organic Matter Recycling Regulation
 - Recycling Regulation
 - Landfill Gas Management Regulation
- Guidance and policy
 - Landfill Criteria
 - Landfill Review
 - Targets
 - MSW disposal per capita
 - Population covered by organics landfill restrictions
 - Food Waste Prevention



REDUCE reduce by as much as possible the amount or toxicity of material that enters the solid waste stream and also the impact on the environment of producing it in the first place

REUSE



ensure that materials or products are reused as many times as possible before entering the solid waste stream

RECYCLE



recycle as much material as possible

RECOVERY


recover as much material and/or energy from the solid waste stream as possible through the application of technology

RESIDUALS MANAGEMENT

provide safe and effective residual management, once the solid waste stream has been reduced through the application of technology

Guide to SWMP

8 Principles for Solid Waste Management

1) Promote zero waste approaches and support a circular economy

2) Promote the first 3 Rs (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle)

3) Maximize beneficial use of waste materials and manage residuals appropriately

4) Support polluter and user-pay approaches and manage incentives to maximize behaviour outcomes

5) Prevent organics and recyclables from going into the garbage wherever practical

6) Collaborate with other regional districts wherever practical

7) Develop collaborative partnerships with interested parties to achieve regional targets set in plans

8) Level the playing field within regions for private and public solid waste management facilities

Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy

Four key areas:

- 1) Bans on Single-Use Packaging
- 2) Dramatically Reduce Single-Use Plastic in Landfills & Waterways
- 3) Expanding Plastic Bottle and Beverage Container Returns
- 4) Reducing Plastics Overall

BC Local Government Bans

Canada

- Federal Government's intention to ban harmful single-use plastics by 2021
- Bans on plastic bags: P.E.I.; Newfoundland and Labrador next

B.C.

- ~29 B.C. local governments have or are in progress of developing plastic bans
 - 12 finalized bans
 - City of Vancouver's Single-Use Reduction Strategy
- Canadian Plastic Bag Association v. City of Victoria



Objectives


- Reduce GHG emissions

 - Consultation summary posted
 July 2019
 - Amendments to the regulation are anticipated for early 2020

Policy Guidance for Waste-to-Energy Facilities

 - 350 kg/capita disposal rate target
 - 60% energy efficiency rate




Reductions to achieve 2030 target
