


Canadian Medical Schools

All 17 Canadian medical schools are accredited to ensure that graduates meet the required conditions to be licensed as a physician in Canada. After successful completion of a full program of medical education and training, you will receive a Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree.

Tips for Applying to Medical School

For General

Undergraduate Students

As an undergraduate student trying to decide which medical school you would like to attend, you have the option of exploring Canadian medical schools and international medical schools. With 17 Canadian medical schools and numerous schools outside of Canada, there are many options to consider.

- . Start your search early there is a lot of information to review.
- . To be eligible to practice medicine in BC, the medical school that you attend must be listed in the World Directory of Medical Schools and be recognized in Canada.
- . Tuition fees for medical schools vary.
- Pay attention to which schools accept applications from international students.
- . In order to be eligible to practice medicine in BC, the medical school that you attend must be listed in the World Directory of Medical Schools and be recognized in Canada.
- . Canadian clinical experience will help with the application for residency in Canada. Take note of medical schools that support students to gain Canadian clinical experience (through clinical electives in Canada).

<u>physiciansapply.ca</u> is a centralized, confidential website for medical students, international medical graduates, and Canadian medical graduates to:

- Apply for medical registration.
- Register for exams and see exam results.
- Verify and store their medical credentials.
- Share credentials and documents with registered organizations.
- Have their credentials and other related documents translated.
- Request an Educational Credential Assessment for immigration to Canada.

CANADIAN RESIDENT MATCHING SERVICE (CaRMS)

The Canadian Resident Matching Service (CaRMS) is a

- CaRMS uses a <u>Match Algorithm</u> to match students into postgraduate medical training programs throughout Canada.
- The R-1 Main Residency Match is for entry level postgraduate positions and is offered in two iterations each year.
- The first iteration is available to all graduating students and prior year graduates from Canada and the US who meet the basic eligibility criteria and have no prior postgraduate training in Canada or the US. It is also open to graduates from international medical schools (IMGs) who meet the basic criteria and have no prior postgraduate training in Canada or the US.
- The second iteration includes positions and applicants not matched in the first iteration, as well as applicants with previous Canadian or US postgraduate training and other applicants who did not participate in the first iteration.

DID YOU KNOW:

- . Working in British Columbia as a general practitioner can be a very rewarding experience?
- Local Divisions of Family Practice can provide you with community support including information about housing, transportation, childcare, schools, and job opportunities?
- BC job opportunities for GPs can include teaching medical students and residents, being part of a maternity care
 group, working in special clinics (mental health, youth, seniors), and residential care?
- There is plenty of work available for family medicine residents after graduation ranging from family practice locum in urban, suburban and rural settings, to sessional and consultant work?
- GPs practicing in BC may be eligible to receive incentive payments for coordinated, longitudinal patient care in areas such as chronic disease management, maternity care, and mental health?
- The number of Canadian medical school applications received each year far outweighs the number of spots available?
- Electives will enable international medical graduates to gain clinical experience and get a reference letter to submit with the application to CaRMS?
- A clinical traineeship is one way to gain essential Canadian clinical experience for international medical graduates interested in applying for a residency program in BC?
- Your journey to practice in BC can include costs to obtain and submit your credentials, write exams, register for licensing, as well as costs to relocate from another country or province?




Recruitment & Retention Toolkit



Recruitment and retention of family physicians in BC has been a key priority for most divisions of family practice, due to various factors including a significant number of retiring family physicians, rapid population growth, and an aging population.

The Family Physician Recruitment and Retention Toolkit was developed to provide easy access to best or promising practice processes, tools, and templates that can assist divisions and their partners (e.g., health authorities, municipalities) in their local recruitment, retention, and practice coverage efforts. For ease of use the toolkit is divided into six main sections: Being Prepared, Attracting GPs, Engaging GPs, Licensing and Privileging, Support and Keep GPs, Retirement and Succession Planning.


