

2019 UBCM Convention – Series of Resolutions Articles

Article #5 - What is a Consent Agenda Block and Why do we use them?

Depending on the category in which the resolution is placed and depending on the recommendation made by UBCM's Resolutions Committee, resolutions will be grouped into a Consent Agenda Block (or just Block), or considered individually.

Resolutions placed in the categories: SR, ER, A, B2b and B3b are all considered individually.

Resolutions placed in the categories: B1, B2a and B3a are considered as Blocks. Blocks are used to group resolutions, which reflect existing UBCM member policy.

Block resolutions have the recommendation of Endorse or Endorse with Proposed Amendment. With the recommendation of endorse the membership can consider the Block in a single vote to endorse them all at once.

Members do have the ability to remove one or more resolutions from a Block, but only if they wish to propose an amendment or to speak against the resolution.
