What does BCREA endorse?

• Transparency and accountability to and by all professionals involved in real estate transactions with efficient regulatory structures.



 BCREA participated in both provincial government reviews, and commissioned a vulnerability assessment of residential and commercial transactions.



 We worked with four other real estate sector organizations on joint AML best practices and recommendations.

Recommendations:

- Accept only verified funds
- Mandatory anti-money laundering education
- Smart regulation
- Ongoing engagement
- Timely and transparent reporting



Expert Panel Reports:

Both Peter German and the Expert Panel criticize REALTORS[®] for not filing many suspicious transaction reports and for poor compliance statistics with FINTRAC.

Notably, they also criticize FINTRAC for not providing adequate feedback, data and resources. Make the distinction between poor administrative compliance and complicity with money laundering.

The reports (especially the Expert Panel) also note the need for coordination among governments and across the country (what we call smart regulation).



Expert Panel Reports:

- Both reports name many other professions and the provincial and federal governments as vital stakeholders in dealing with AML.
- The Expert Panel also explains that real estate is complex and it can be difficult to identify criminal activity in a context where most people are legitimate.

- Ongoing work with government around regulatory change.
