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Community, Culture and Recreation Program

Part of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program

Infrastructure for public use and benefit that supports new, expanded or renewed community, culture and recreation facilities



Eligible Applicants:

• Local governments, Indigenous communities, and Not-for-profit organizations.

Funding for projects that:

- Upgrade and build community, recreational, or cultural infrastructure for communities, including Indigenous peoples and vulnerable populations
- When included in new facilities, dedicated spaces for health and education that uphold the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action

Rural and Northern Communities Program

Part of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program

Infrastructure for public use and benefit that addresses the unique challenges faced by rural and remote communities



Eligible Applicants:

- Local governments, Indigenous communities, and not-for-profit (and for selected outcomes for-profit) organizations; and
- Communities with populations of 25,000 or less, outside Metro Vancouver and the urban regions of the Capital Regional District.

Supporting community infrastructure priorities, including:

- Broadband connectivity
- Food security
- Efficient and reliable energy
- Indigenous health and educational facilities
- Cultural facilities

- Reliable road, air or marine access
- Improved local public transit
- Resilience to natural disasters
- Environmental quality
- Community and recreation

CleanBC Communities Fund (CCF)

Under the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP)

Infrastructure for public use and benefit that supports renewable and clean energy projects for greenhouse gas emissions reductions



Eligible applicants:

• Local governments, Indigenous applicants (on or off-reserve), and Not-for-profit or Forprofit organizations when partnered with Local government or Indigenous government

Funding for projects that:

- Support BC's greenhouse gas reduction priorities and clean energy sector
- Improve the management of renewable energy, generation of clean energy, access to clean-energy transportation, and energy efficiency of buildings

Environmental Quality Program

Part of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program

Infrastructure to support environmental quality outcomes



Eligible Applicants:

• Local governments and Indigenous communities where the project will result in services being delivered to land off-reserve.

Funding for projects that:

- Increase capacity to treat and/or manage wastewater or stormwater;
- Increase access to potable water; or
- Increase capacity to reduce and/or remediate soil and/or air pollutants.

Infrastructure Planning Grant Program

Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing

Direct support for local government efforts to plan for construction and replacement of infrastructure, focusing on planning, designing, and managing community infrastructure towards sustainable service delivery



Eligible Applicants:

- Local governments:
 - o Municipality
 - o Regional District

 Local governments can submit on behalf of improvement districts, registered utilities, or small water systems and include the letter of request from that organization

Supporting a range of initiatives that promote sustainable infrastructure including, but not limited to:

- Assess feasibility, costs, location, technology and other factors to improve or develop water, sewer, drainage, and active transportation infrastructure
- Increase energy efficiency
- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- Asset Management
