Provincial-LG Collaboration

- ◆ In September 2017, UBCM and Province formed the Joint Provincial-Local Government Committee on Cannabis Regulation (JCCR).
- Co-chaired by Lisa Anderson / Mary Shaw and Councillor Kerry Jang.
- Committee meets regularly to discuss issues affecting local governments. JCCR/UBCM recommendations conveyed through written submissions.

Enforcement

- British Columbia's Cannabis Control and Licensing Act creates a number of new cannabis offences, and provides the enforcement authority to address illegal retail activity and sales.
- ◆ The Province has created a Community Safety Unit that will be responsible for addressing illegal sales activities.



Remaining Issues

Some of the remaining work includes:

- Completing an excise tax revenue sharing agreement between the Province and UBCM (discussed later in this session).
- Managing new and ongoing issues (e.g. regulating edibles).
- Developing a full rural retail framework.
- ◆ Evaluating the provincial framework.
