Child Care Planning, Development and Support In Richmond

The City of Richmond and other stakeholders work together to address the need for quality, affordable, accessible child care spaces in Richmond.

Over time, the City has gradually undertaken a series of actions that confirm a commitment to child care as an essential service.

These actions included:

- Child Care Policy – 1991
- Advisory Body – 1993
- Child Care Reserve – 1994
- Needs Assessment and Plan – 1995
- Constructing 4 child care facilities – 1996-1999
- Child Care Coordinator (contractor)– 2006



Child Care Planning, Development and Support In Richmond

Over time, each of these elements have been reviewed and updated.

- Child Care Policy 4017 – updated in 2019
- Child Care Development Advisory Committee –TOR updated in 2019
- Child Care Reserve – 3 reserves serving unique functions
- 2017 – 2022 Child Care Needs Assessment and Strategy
- 10 City-owned child care facilities, 2 ECDH and 1 additional child care in construction
- Program Manager, Child Care and Planner 1, Child Care RFT/RPT positions within Community Social Development, Planning and Development
- 2021 – 2031 Richmond Child Care Action Plan

Richmond Child Care Needs and Demographics

In 2016 there were only **9 spaces** per 100 children aged 0 to 36 months in Richmond



In 2020 there were **23.1 GROUP CARE (UNDER 36 MONTHS) SPACES**

per 100 children aged 0 to 2 years in Richmond

In 2020 there were

53.7

GROUP CARE (30 MONTHS TO SCHOOL AGE) SPACES per 100

children aged 3 to 5 years in Richmond



Between 2016 and 2018 there was a

decrease of 1.8% in the number

of child care spaces for school-aged children, per 100 children aged 6 to 12 years



In 2020, there were

14.2 GROUP CARE (SCHOOL

AGE) SPACES per 100 children.

Child Care Through Development

- Use of the OCP, Community Amenity Contributions and Zoning
- City-owned facilities
- Quality in child care design

City-Owned Child Care Amenities

Currently the City owns 10 purpose built child care facilities which are leased to not-for-profit operators.



Early Childhood Development Hubs

Early Childhood Development (ECD) Hubs have been identified as a priority.

ECD Hubs have the following characteristics:

- Include licensed child care
- Include early child development or parent support services
- Provide space for community programs and services compatible with child and family development
