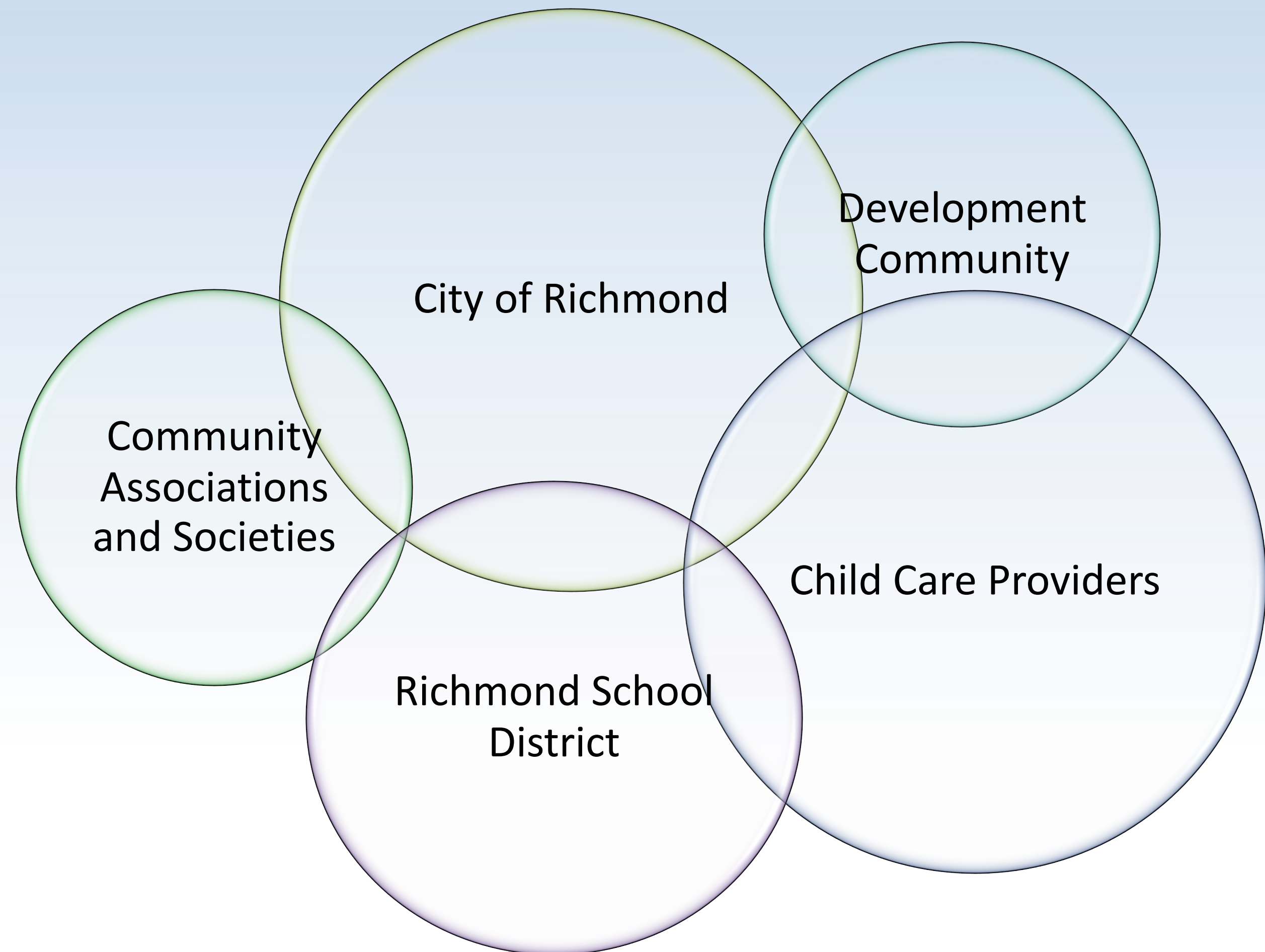

Creation of Licensed Child Care In Richmond

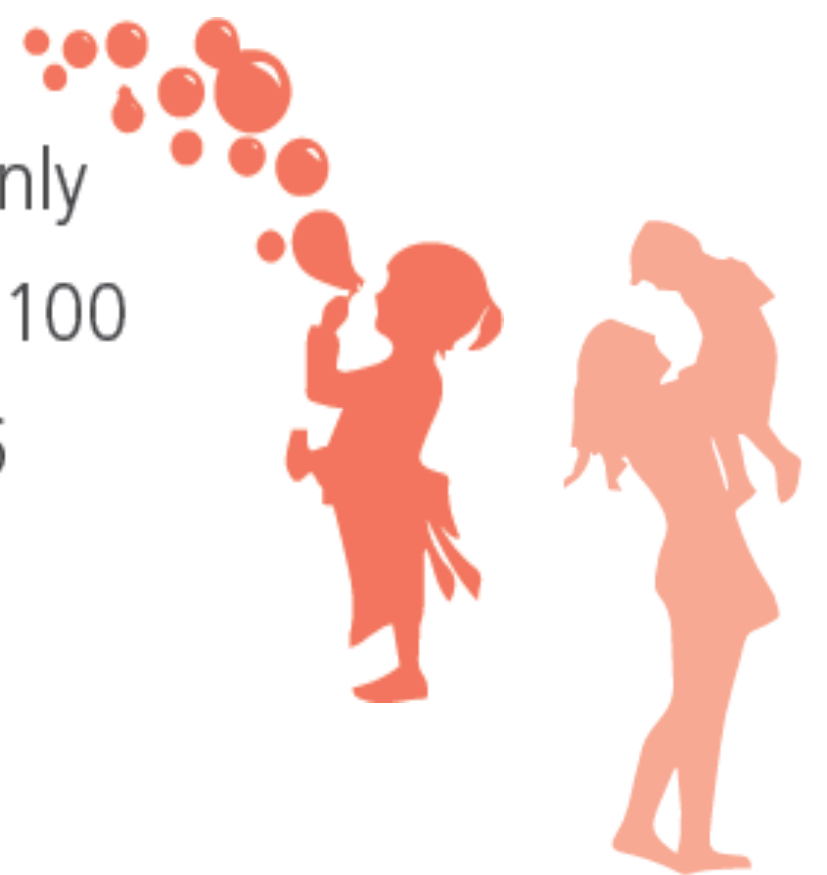
The City of Richmond and other stakeholders work together to address the need for quality, affordable, accessible child care spaces in Richmond.

The creation of child care is a community effort.



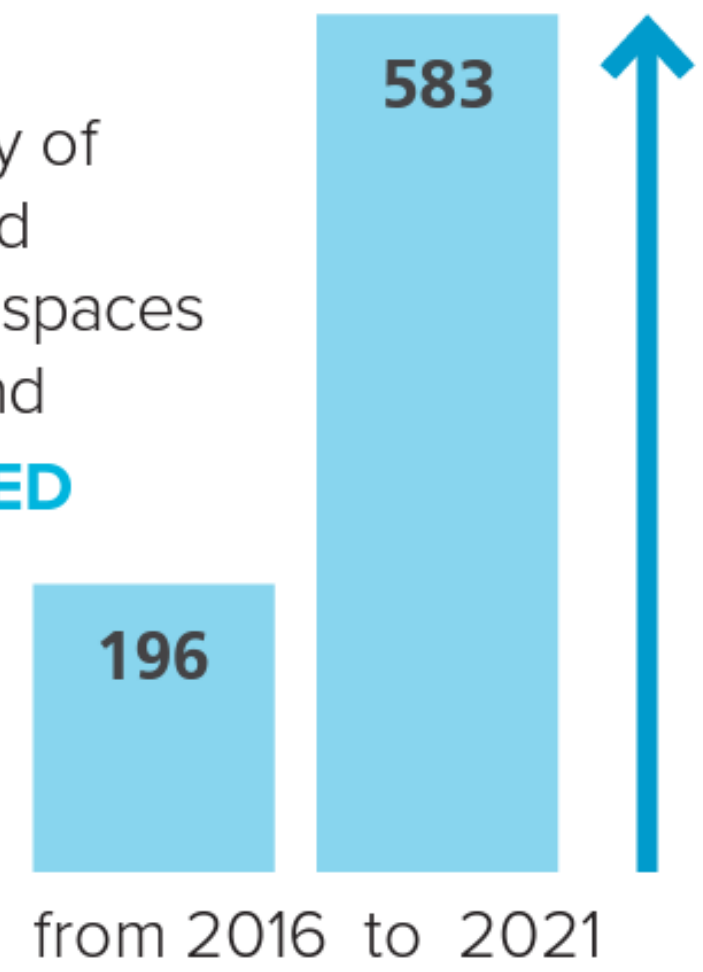
Richmond Child Care Needs and Demographics

In 2016 there were only **9 spaces** per 100 children aged 0 to 36 months in Richmond



In 2021 there were **28.5 GROUP CARE (UNDER 36 MONTHS) SPACES** per 100 children aged 0 to 2 years in Richmond

The supply of City-owned child care spaces in Richmond **INCREASED 200%**



In 2021 there were **60.5 GROUP CARE (30 MONTHS TO SCHOOL AGE) SPACES** per 100 children aged 3 to 5 years in Richmond



In 2021, there were **14.1 GROUP CARE (SCHOOL AGE) SPACES** per 100 children.



2 CITY-OWNED EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT HUBS were completed

A total of **199** new licensed child care spaces



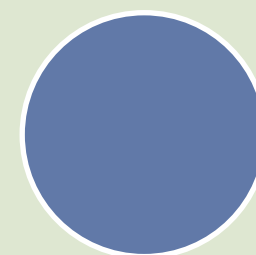
Richmond's Child Care Amenities



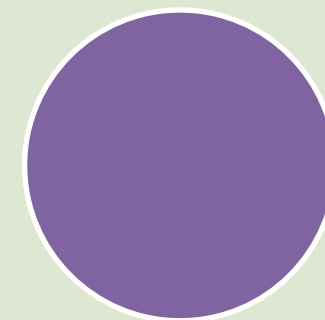
Cranberry Children's Centre – Infant and Toddler spaces

2017-2018 – Willow, Gardens and Seasong – 37 space facilities



2020- River Run – included preschool and school age child care



1990's facilities- 25 space programs - Terra Nova, Cook Road, Riverside, Treehouse

Early Childhood Development Hubs

Early Childhood Development (ECD) Hubs have been identified as a priority. ECD Hubs have the following characteristics:

- Include licensed child care
- Include early child development or parent support services
- Provide space for community programs and services compatible with child and family development

- Official Community Plan
- Zoning
- Community Amenity Contributions and Density Bonuses
- City-owned facilities
- Quality in child care design
