






Creation of Licensed Child Care In Richmond

Richmond Child Care Needs and Demographics


In 2016 there were only

9 spaces per 100
children aged 0 to 36
months in Richmond

In 2021 there were
28.5 group
CARE (UNDER 36
MONTHS) SPACES
per 100 children aged
0 to 2 years in Richmond

In 2021 there were 60.5
GROUP CARE (30 MONTHS TO SCHOOL AGE) SPACES per 100 children aged 3 to 5 years in Richmond



Calls to Action – Our Learnings


In addition to strong support and a commitment to child care from City Council, there are a number of strategies to move child care forward:
