### Housing Futures with AHMA

The commodification of housing is a major contributor to the housing crisis and the suffering of those experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity.

As a top priority, housing needs to be for shelter and not for making money.

### **MUNICIPALITIES CAN...**

Ensure **meaningful engagement and participation** that re-centers Indigenous wisdom to help transform systems.

**Implement** business plan items related to reconciliation and affordable housing.

Include **culturally appropriate wraparound services** to promote healing & reduce barriers.

Cut high-cost development fees and provide low-cost financing.

Include Urban Indigenous housing needs in **Municipal Housing Plans and OCPs** to encourage non-profit and affordable development.

Allocate properties and LAND BACK to local Indigenous communities, where they belong.



### **HOUSING SUPPLY**

Prioritize society's most marginalized and vulnerable people, including:

- women (especially single mothers),
- racialized people,
- gender-diverse people, and
- Indigenous families.



### Housing needs to be...

- Deeply affordable
- Safe and habitable
- Suitable for the family or individual
- Culturally supportive

Advancing reconciliation requires all communities to ensure that decision-making on housing considers the needs of Indigenous Peoples and recognizes that adequate housing is not only foundational to the beginning of a healing path but also <u>a basic human right</u>.

Article 2 of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights requires that investments to further implement the right to housing must reflect a standard of a <u>maximum of available resources</u>.
