Building Gentle Density in BC



Why?

- Fast housing supply potential: no rezoning; no lot assembly
- Widespread public support: 83% of British Columbians
- Cost-efficient for cities, plus added property tax base
- Local economic development

How It Gets Built

Homeowner participation makes projects pencil

Small builders, manufacturers and lenders need confidence-signals

More reforms needed: simple and consistent processes, fair fee structures, aligned regulations

Past/Present:

- Simplify zoning, delegate variances
- Find process bottlenecks and deal with them
- Monitor timelines
- Improve application quality by pre-app & rejecting incomplete submissions
- Allow BC Hydro to determine overhead vs. underground

Future:

- Greater CSS, AI permit review
- Targeted timelines

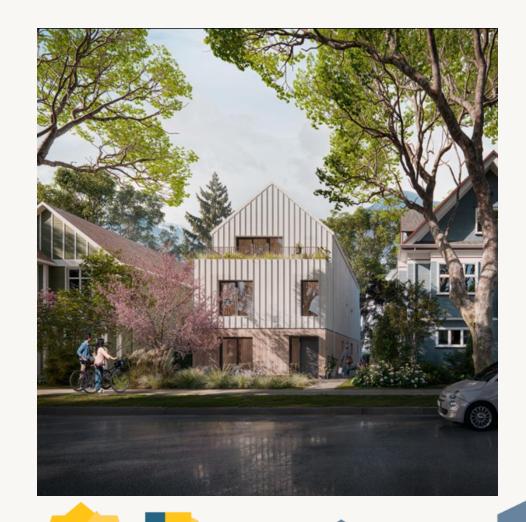


- Organizational shift: Development Services and Engineering departments under 1 umbrella of Community Development; common goal of promoting housing and the infrastructure to support it

- 4 Pre-Approved Plans; Financial Incentives (in progress)
